

Every year, all teachers go through a program of professional learning. This can be in a variety of forms, including post-graduate study, courses and conferences and school visits. All of these opportunities ensure that our staff are looking to constantly improve upon their teaching practice, as they are exposed to new ideas and insights. Our teachers then bring these back to our college and share them with others to enable a collective approach to continuous improvement. The goal of all professional learning is to act as a catalyst for improving teaching practice in light of new research and contextual understanding.

The dedication displayed by staff to their own development is essential for improving the educational experience of students at Arndell Anglican College. By continuing to learn and update their knowledge and skills, our teaching staff are able to set an example of the importance of lifelong learning. Additionally, this ensures our teachers are on the cutting edge of research and innovation, leading to an improved classroom experience for our students.

In order to deliver optimal professional learning, there are several core principles that need to be embedded when designing this for staff. Firstly, any course needs to be based on research. This ensures that there is evidence backing any new strategies that we introduce.

Secondly, professional learning needs to be a collaborative process where teachers work together to build new knowledge. Finally, there needs to be a focus on the practical application of new knowledge.

In 2023, Arndell will be launching a new professional practice cycle that embraces these principles. Staff will select professional goals they wish to work on across the course of the year, will engage with research in collaboration with one another and will engage in observations to practically apply what they have learned.

Our new Teaching and Learning Growth Cycle will seek to continually improve the educational experience of students at Arndell.

Comfort

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

Isaiah 40:1 (NIV)



I love putting on a pack and hiking through the bush. I enjoy the nature and beauty of God's creation and the opportunity to see the intricacies, like a waterfall, a view, the way different plants grow and thrive. So often, this can only be seen by walking to it. At the same time, there have been times when I've completed challenging hikes. One time, I climbed a 500m ascent to only have to walk back down and then back up another 500m. All of this with a heavier than usual pack. I remember the last few kilometres, on much more level ground, walking back out to the car as some of the most challenging walking I've done. My legs were like jelly and then they started cramping up. I had nothing left, to this day I still don't know how I made it to the end.

God's people went through something far tougher. They were made to pay double for their rebellion against God in the 6th century BC. They were taken off into exile, then forced to do hard labour for 70 years. It makes my hike sound like a little stroll in the park. I can imagine they felt like they had nothing left every day.

Yet, God had a plan. God's plan was to bring them back. That, after their punishment, they would come and find comfort in him. Now, thousands of years later we know his plan for comfort went well beyond just coming back to their promised land. Through Jesus we can have eternal comfort. I'm so thankful for this message of comfort. It means that even though we may go through tough times, or even joyful times, I'm reminded God has a bigger plan. A plan for us to be in relationship with him through his son. I pray that you too might know this comfort.

School Bus 5085 - AM Service

Dear Parents and Students,

Due to the upcoming roadworks at the intersection of Grose Vale Rd and Grose River Rd – North Richmond, there will be a change to **School Bus 5085**.

Commencing Monday 21st November 2022 will depart from Grose Vale Rd and Riverview St at 6:49am (15 minutes earlier) and operate the current route to Grose Vale Rd and Peaks Rd then via Grose Vale Rd, left Grose Wold Rd, right Grose River Rd, right Ashtons Rd to Nutmans Rd, turns around & returns Ashtons Rd, left Grose River Rd, left Grose Wold Rd, left Grose Vale Rd, then continues current route to Richmond Station and school.

The bus will omit Grose River Rd between Grose Vale Rd and Grose Wold Rd.

Services will return to normal from Day 1 Term 1 2023.

STUDENT OPAL CARDS

If your child travels to school by HIllsBus or Busways bus, please ensure your child has a valid Opal card (either a School or Child/Youth Opal card).

Encourage your child to tap on when they board and tap off when they arrive at their stop.

The Opal card data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services.

During Term 4, they are focusing on increasing the compliance with tapping on and off with school Opal cards.

This is a requirement of bus travel that your child has a valid Student Opal card, and that they tap on and off each time they use the school bus or route bus service. This is outlined in the TfNSW Code of Conduct as follows:

"It is a condition of the School Pass Terms and the Student Codes of Conduct when travelling that students in possession of the School Opal card must tap on and tap off every time when using public transport to travel to and from school. Per section 3.2 of the Opal Privacy Policy, Transport for NSW collects information from taps on and tap offs to support coordination, planning and policy development for transport, transport services and transport infrastructure."

It's been noted that students from our school using the bus service have not been tapping on or off. In Term 4, there will be a strong focus on getting students back into good habits of tapping on and tapping off with their student Opal card.

We're requesting your help to restore the tap on and off numbers to match the travelling numbers to benefit the students, parents, school, and bus operator.
